Congratulations Bill – that is an amazing accomplishment!





Gilly's House is a sober house for men, located in Wrentham Massachusetts, which can accommodate 21 residents. It is a MASH (Massachusetts Alliance of Sober Housing) certified and non-profit sober



house for men who have completed an addiction treatment program and are looking for a structured and supportive place to live to continue their commitment to recovery.

Did you know?

- St. Patrick was not Irish. Despite being the patron saint of Ireland, St. Patrick was born in Britain in either Scotland or Wales (accounts tend to vary on that point). His parents, Calpurnius and Conchessa, were both Roman citizens and his mother gave birth to him in 385AD. St. Patrick's given name was Maewyn Succat. It wasn't until he became a priest that he adopted a new name - Patrick, after Patricius (which relates to the Latin root meaning father).
- It wasn't until 1798, the year of the Irish Rebellion, that green became officially associated with St. Patrick's Day. Up until the rebellion, the color associated with St. Patrick was blue, as it was featured both in the royal court and on ancient Irish flags. But as the British wore red, the Irish chose to wear green, and they sang the song "The Wearing of the Green" during the rebellion, cementing the color's relevance in Irish history.




And now back to our regularly scheduled project updates.....

Book Club – Lisa Jolicoeur – March Meeting will be Thursday 3/7

On Thursday, February 8, 2024, Book Club members gathered to discuss The Keeper of Lost Things by Ruth Hogan at the home of Lisa J. while enjoying some Valentine's Daythemed macarons (thank you, Monique!), crackers, cheese, fruit, and tea.

Book Club members enjoyed discussing this novel. We had some great discussions about audio books, the short stories within the novel inspired by the lost items, the interesting characters, including the "ghost," the interesting way the main stories from two different time periods come together through the finding of "lost things," and the interesting and satisfying ending.

For these reasons, the book earned mostly 1.5's but also a couple of 2's and one 3 on our rating scale: 1 being "drop everything, turn off the phone, and read; no one should bother me until I am done; I might even be late for work or sunburned if reading outside; " 2 being "good, leave the phone on, recommend to my friends, not good enough to earn a 1 for a potential flaw, but worth reading"; 3 being "glad I bought it and read it, will talk to my book friends about it, but I am not recommending it to all my friends; 4 being "I regret paying money for the book, but it's tolerable if I didn't pay hard earned money for it"; and 5 being "I wish I had not read it and wasted precious hours of my life."




March 7th: The Boston Girl by Anita Diamant: Anita Diamant's "vivid, affectionate portrait of American womanhood" (Los Angeles Times), follows the life of one woman, Addie Baum, through a period of dramatic change. Addie is The Boston Girl, the spirited daughter of an immigrant Jewish family, born in 1900 to parents who were unprepared for America and its effect on their three daughters. Growing up in the North End of Boston, then a teeming multicultural neighborhood, Addie's intelligence and curiosity take her to a world her parents can't imagine—a world of short skirts, movies, celebrity culture, and new opportunities for women. Addie wants to finish high school and dreams of going to college. She wants a career and to find true love. From the one-room tenement apartment she shared with her parents and two sisters, to the library group for girls she joins at a neighborhood settlement house, to her first, disastrous love affair, to finding the love of her life, eighty-five-year-old Addie recounts her adventures with humor and compassion for the naïve girl she once was.

April 4, 2024 The Last Story of Mina Lee: A Reese's Book Club Pick By Nancy Jooyoun Kim

Riveting and unconventional, *The Last Story of Mina Lee* traces the farreaching consequences of secrets in the lives of a Korean immigrant mother and her daughter

Margot Lee's mother is ignoring her calls. Margot can't understand why, until she makes a surprise trip home to Koreatown, LA, and finds that her mother has suspiciously died. Determined to discover the truth, Margot unravels her single mother's past as a Korean War orphan and an undocumented immigrant, only to realize how little she truly knew about her mother, Mina. Thirty years earlier, Mina Lee steps off a plane to take a chance on a new life in America. Stacking shelves at a Korean grocery store, the last thing she expects is to fall in love. But that moment leads to repercussions for Mina that echo through the decades, leading up to the truth of what happened the night of her death.



Told through the intimate lens of a mother and daughter who have struggled all their lives to understand each other, *The Last Story of Mina Lee* is a powerful and exquisitely woven debut novel that explores identity, family, secrets, and what it truly means to belong.


Sand for Seniors- Sophia Manos and Mike Mills (Concluding)

The Foxboro Jaycees will once again be holding our **Spring Craft and Vendor Fair on the Foxboro Common** on **Saturday, May 4th 2024.** The event will be free to the public and open from 9:00am to 3:00pm. We are inviting crafters, artists, and vendors from the area to set up exhibits on the Common.

Your space will be reserved on a first come, first serve basis, so please mail your form & payment today!

Registration Fees:

\$45 if postmarked March 4th through March 22nd 2024 \$50 if postmarked March 23rd through April 26th 2024

- Your <u>non-refundable</u> registration fee includes the rental of a 10'x10' space on the Common; you will need to bring a table and chairs to display your items. If you wish, you can set up a pop-up tent in your space as well. Please do not set up sides on your tent. Access to electricity at the Common is not guaranteed and there is no WI-FI available, so please plan accordingly.
- Payment Options:
 - Check or Money Order made payable to the Foxboro Jaycees.
 - PayPal or Venmo (Additional fee applies) Sign and submit registration form by mail to receive confirmation for PayPal / Venmo submission. We will not hold spaces until payment is received in full. Please do NOT send payment until approved to do so. You are not guaranteed a spot unless a committee member confirms your registration form has been received.
 - All registration forms MUST be mailed. Emailed registration forms will be discarded unless specifically requested by a committee member.
- Since this is an outdoor event, we have scheduled a rain date, which will be Sunday, May 5th. In the event of inclement weather, we will notify you one day prior to the event (Friday May 3rd) if the Fair will be postponed to the rain date. No refunds will be issued if the event is postponed until the rain date. If we are forced to cancel the event completely, a 50% discount will be instituted for any paid vendor who requests it for the next scheduled fair only.
- Set-up will begin at 7:30am. You will be allowed to clean up from 3-4pm. You will be responsible for removing all your items. Please help us keep the Foxboro Common clean.
- Vehicles are not allowed on the Town Common. Parking is available, but limited, around the Common for setup
 and cleanup. You will be required to park in other areas during the event to leave spaces for visitors. A shuttle
 may be available to take you to / from your vehicle. If a shuttle is not available, you may request that a Jaycee
 watch your booth until you have returned from parking.
- If you will be selling food, you are required to obtain a mobile food permit from the Foxboro Board of Health at least 30 days prior to the event (or pay a late fee). More information can be found: http://www.foxboroughma.gov/Pages/FoxboroughMA Health/index
